1. With God

*The true test about God...what happens when it
does not go your way.

*He is true to Himself.

2. With Us

*Expect that time is not a factor, but is useful.

*Expect that there are consequences to our choices.

God intervenes on man's behalf and starts over with 4 couples.

God's choice — Abram

God's plan — Joseph

The Story brings us to:

God's deliverance — Moses — Exodus

The beginning:

Exodus 2:9 Then Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this child away and nurse him for me and I will give you your wages." So the woman took the child and nursed him. **10** The child grew, and she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter and he became her son. And she named him Moses, and said, "Because I drew him out of the water."

12 So he looked this way and that, and when he saw there was no one around, he struck down the Egyptian and hid him in the sand. **15** When Pharaoh heard of this

matter, he tried to kill Moses. But Moses fled from the presence of Pharaoh and settled in the land of Midian, and he sat down by a well. **21** Moses was willing to dwell with the man, and he gave his daughter Zipporah to Moses.

The Call

Exodus 3:2 The angel of the LORD appeared to him in a blazing fire from the midst of a bush; and he looked, and behold, the bush was burning with fire, yet the bush was not consumed. **6** He said also, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." Then Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. **10** "Therefore, come now, and I will send you to Pharaoh, so that you may bring My people, the sons of Israel, out of Egypt." **14** God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM "; and He said, "Thus you shall say to the sons of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you.' " **21** "I will grant this people favor the sight of the Egyptians; and it shall be that when you go, you will not go empty-handed. **22** "But every woman shall ask of her neighbor and the woman who lives in her house, articles of silver and articles of gold, and clothing; and you will put them on your sons and daughters. Thus you will plunder the Egyptians." **4:17** "You shall take in your hand this staff, with which you shall perform the signs." **6:1** Then the LORD said to Moses, "Now you shall see what I will do to Pharaoh; for under compulsion he will let them go, and under compulsion he will drive them out of his land."

Exodus 7:9 "When Pharaoh speaks to you, saying, 'Work a miracle,' then you shall say to Aaron, 'Take your staff and throw it down before Pharaoh, that it may become a serpent.'"

1. **Death of first born** — Exodus 11:3-5

2. Passover — Exodus 12:7, 12-14
