Question: What does this foundation affirm?

1. This foundation affirms the importance of God's Word as it is applied to both our <u>doctrinal understanding</u> and our <u>daily</u>, <u>practical living</u>.

Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says...the man who looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues to do this, not forgetting what he has heard, but doing it—he will be blessed in what he does.

James 1:22-25

2. This foundation includes the fact that both fellowship and ministry are based solely on one's <u>personal faith in Jesus Christ</u> as Savior and Lord, trusting Him alone for salvation.

Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved.

Acts 4:12

Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to one hope when you were called—one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

3. This foundation affirms the priesthood of every believer.

But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His wonderful light.

4. This foundation affirms the fact that we believe in the <u>spiritual unity</u> of the Church. We believe that there is strength in <u>diversity</u> and that each of us are uniquely gifted by the Spirit of God and yet we need each other to be the body, (the church) that God desires.
