PATTERNS

Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—His good, pleasing and perfect will.

- Do as **little** as you can
- Accumulate as **much** as you can
- Get away with anything you can, and
- Don't **get caught**

PROCLAMATION

What does it mean?

Announce officially or publicly, declare something one considers important with due emphasis, demonstrate or indicate clearly

Proclamation is not **just about speaking**, it's also about **actions**.

What does the Bible say?

We proclaim Him, admonishing every man and teaching every man with all wisdom, so that we may present every man complete in Christ.

—Colossians 1:28

But you are A CHOSEN RACE, A royal PRIESTHOOD, A HOLY NATION, A PEOPLE FOR [God's] OWN POSSESSION, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light...

—1 Peter 2:9

...what we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ.

—1 John 1:3

Jesus gave us a plan for proclamation.

Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and He said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ would suffer and rise again from the dead the third day, and that repentance for forgiveness of sins would be proclaimed in His name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. "You are witnesses of these things."

WHAT, WHERE, HOW, WHO

What is the message?

Repentance and forgiveness of sins

We proclaim the:

- Acceptableness of repentance
- Motives for repentance
- Repentance as a lifestyle

He who conceals his transgressions will not prosper, But he who confesses and forsakes {them} will find compassion.

It's a message for all people, at all times.

God's forgiveness is **final** and **irreversible**.

How does proclamation of repentance for forgiveness of sins affect "getting away with anything"? What affect does it have on your integrity? Does it change WHO is important to you?
